Minutes of the Meeting under s. 13.10

February 15, 2023

Co-Chair Marklein presided and called the meeting to order.

I. Department of Natural Resources

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to provide a Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant of \$400,000 from the local assistance subprogram to the Town of Grand Chute for the Arrowhead Park redevelopment project.

II. Department of Justice

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the creation of 2.0 FTE GPR permanent positions in fiscal year 2022-23 in the department's general program operations appropriation under s. 20.455(1)(a) for field prosecutors based in Wausau and Appleton. The positions will replace 2.0 FTE GPR five-year project positions which will end in April, 2023.

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the six settlement agreements submitted by the department to the Joint Committee on Finance under s. 165.08. Pursuant to s. 165.10, and in light of the presumption embodied in s. 20.906(1), the Committee believes that the Attorney General must deposit all settlement funds, including attorneys' fees from settlements, into the general fund for general revenue purposes. However, in light of the decision in Wis. State Legislature v. Kaul, No. 2021-CV-152 (Wis. Cir. Ct. Polk Cnty.) on the meaning of s. 165.10, the committee approves the proposed plans, notwithstanding the plans' failure to commit all attorneys' fees into the general fund for general revenue purposes. The Committee notes, however, that the decision in Wisconsin State Legislature v. Kaul on the meaning of s. 165.10 is currently on appeal. See Wis. State Legislature v. Kaul, No. 2022-AP-431 (Wis. Ct. App. notice of appeal filed Mar. 14, 2022). Should the appellants prevail in that ongoing appeal as to the meaning of s. 165.10, the Committee will expect the Attorney General at that time to deposit all attorneys' fees from these settlements into the general fund for general revenue purposes.

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IX. Department of Transportation

Moved by Senator Johnson and seconded by Representative Goyke to approve alternatives A1, B1. The motion approves the department's plan, as amended by the department to reflect the most recent estimate of 2022-23 federal highway funds.

Moved by Representative Born and seconded by Senator Marklein to approve Motion 4. The motion reads as follows: Move to approve the Department of Transportation's plan, as amended, to adjust the Department's 2022-23 appropriations to allocate additional federal aid, as modified by the following:

- (a) Specify that the \$4,201,000 FED in additional funds requested for the Department's congestion mitigation and air quality improvement program may only be used to fund eligible right-of-way improvement projects that reduce congestion or improve traffic flow, or eligible traffic signaling improvements.
- (b) Specify that the \$15,573,100 FED requested from the federal carbon reduction program may only be used for federally eligible projects to replace street lighting and traffic control devices with energy-efficient alternatives, projects to deploy advanced transportation and congestion management technologies, or right-of-way improvement projects to improve traffic flow that do not involve construction of new capacity.
