Governor Walker Announces \$1.49 Million in Grants for Wisconsin's Coastal Communities

Governor Scott Walker today announced \$1.49 million in grants to protect and improve the natural resources, support quality of life and foster economic development in Wisconsin's coastal communities. Administered by the Wisconsin Department of Administration's Wisconsin Coastal Management Program, the 39 grants will be used by non-governmental non-profit organizations, as well as local, state, and tribal governments to assist with projects totaling nearly \$4.4 million.

The Great Lakes of Michigan and Superior are a tremendous natural resource, a reason people live and visit Wisconsin, and as such are a valuable asset to the State. Wisconsin continues to enhance and protect its natural coastal resources through partners and leveraging local, state, federal and private funding and expertise.

The intergovernmental and private sector collaborations aided by the Wisconsin Coastal Management Program advance Wisconsin and regional Great Lakes priorities such as enhancing public access, sustainable use practices, habitat restoration, and pollution control.

Recipients for this year's grants were recommended by the Wisconsin Coastal Management Council, a Governor-appointed citizen and governmental advisory group. The funds are part of Wisconsin's federally-funded Coastal Management Program.

The Wisconsin Coastal Management Program balances natural resource protection and sustainable economic development along Wisconsin's Great Lakes coasts. The program awards federal funds from the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management in the U.S. Department of Commerce National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, to local governments and other entities for innovative coastal initiatives.
