

During that time I was project coordinator for scores of controversial projects including minerals leasing, ski area development, private access, state/federal jurisdiction, energy relicensing, endangered species, private rights, ecosystem restoration, and land use planning. I have been an in-house mediator and facilitator for numerous Forest Service inter-agency and private party disputes. I have designed and implemented public involvement strategies to help avoid disputes. I designed and mediated a conflict resolution process to help the Forest Service resolve many disputes with land use plans involving 13 National Forests in 8 states. I am currently working with the Wisconsin Council on Forestry and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to facilitate their efforts to create "Wisconsin's Forestry Best Management Practices For Invasive Species."
