

Municipal Consolidation using s. 66.0230 Wis. Stats.

Enables a Town, or part of a town, to consolidate with a contiguous city or village

1) Pledge to Provide Services

Consolidating communities adopt identical resolutions describing how residents will be provided with the following services:

- ✓Parks
- ✓Library
- ✓Fire & EMS
- ✓Ownership of Government Bldngs.
- ✓Municipal Sewer Service
- ✓Public Health
- ✓Animal Control
- ✓Police

AND

2) Boundary Agreements with Neighbors

Consolidating city or village develops boundary agreements with each adjacent municipality, with the consolidating town's approval.

AND

3) Comprehensive Plan

Consolidating town and city or village develops a comprehensive plan for the territory. If less than the entire town is consolidating, arrangements must be made to transfer the town remnant to neighboring municipalities.



4) Approval by Ordinance

Consolidating town and city or Village pass by 2/3 vote an ordinance approving of the consolidation.

AND

5) Referendum

Vote held by the residents of each community's residents. If a majority of the votes cast in each Community are for consolidation, the ordinances take effect.

AND

6) Certification of Results

If the referendum votes in each Community are in favor of Consolidation, then the ordinances and referendum results are filed with and certified by the Wisconsin Department of Administration.
