Petroleum Inspection Fee Obligations

Summary: The budget bill, as adopted by the state legislature and approved in

> part by the governor, reduces the petroleum inspection fee, which is the source of payment for the petroleum inspection fee revenue obligations. Section 2094 of the budget bill, which was signed into law by the governor on July 25, 2005 as 2005 Wisconsin Act 25, amends Section 168.12 (1), Wis. Stats. by reducing the petroleum inspection fee from \$0.03 (3 cents) per gallon to \$0.02 (2 cents) per gallon, effective May 1, 2006. Had a petroleum inspection fee of \$0.02 (2 cents) per gallon been effective during fiscal years 1995 through 2004, the amounts of petroleum fees collected during those fiscal years would have been approximately 66.7% of the amounts shown on pages 247-248 of the State of Wisconsin
