SUBJECT: Preliminary 2024-25 General Fund Tax Collections

Preliminary information regarding general fund tax collections for the 2024-25 fiscal year is now available. According to the Department of Revenue (DOR), collections totaled \$22,362.6 million in 2024-25, which was 4.8% higher than the previous year.

This office's final estimate of 2024-25 tax collections, projected on May 15, was \$22,274.3 million. Actual collections were \$88.3 million, or 0.4%, above the estimated amount.

The attached table shows a comparison of the estimated and preliminary actual general fund tax collections by tax type, along with the differences between the estimated and preliminary actual amounts. The figures in the table are based on preliminary reports of 2024-25 tax revenues provided by DOR. Final general fund tax collections, along with departmental revenues and expenditures for 2024-25, will be available in mid-October when the state's <u>Annual Fiscal Report</u> is released by the Department of Administration.

General purpose revenues (GPR) increased 4.8% in fiscal year 2025 (FY25) to \$22,362.6 million. This is 0.4% more than the Legislative Fiscal Bureau's May 15, 2025 estimate of \$22,274.3 million.

^{**} Excise taxes also include the Operator's Permit Fees, which totaled \$47K in FY25.

These are unaudited figures subject to final review by the State Controller's Office prior to the publication of the Department of Administration's Annual Fiscal Report to be released October 15, 2025. Additionally, the Legislative Audit Bureau performs an audit of the State's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report which is published in December of each year.

These collections do not offer guidance on the budget balance for FY25. Other general purpose revenues and the final general purpose revenue expenditures will have substantial bearing on the final budget balance.

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
