# Wisconsin Coastal Management Grants Available

The Wisconsin Coastal Management Program (WCMP) is seeking proposals to enhance, preserve, protect and restore resources within the state's coastal zone—all counties adjacent to Lakes Superior and Michigan, with their nearly 1000 miles of shoreline. We anticipate awarding approximately \$1.5 million in grant funding.

WCMP grants are available for coastal wetland protection and habitat restoration, nonpoint source pollution control, coastal resource and community planning, Great Lakes education, public access and historic preservation. Applications are due November 3, 2014.

Applicants are encouraged to contact WCMP staff early to discuss ideas for project proposals and application requirements. When developing proposals, please pay close attention to the following items:

Application materials and the Request for Proposals are available on the WCMP website at http://coastal.wisconsin.gov.

There is a cost-share requirement for all projects. Matching funds must be from non-federal sources, and may be in the form of in-kind contributions.

For habitat restoration and construction projects, be sure to include copies of all required permits or permit applications and title documentation with the application materials.

For all projects, be sure to include copies of required documentation and letters of support.

#### **Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services Funding**

The Department of Homeland Security administers the Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) program. The AFG Program consists of three different funding opportunities. Information including program guidance documents, frequently asked questions, and the link to the applications can be found at http://www.fema.gov/firegrants.

#### Assistance to Firefighter Grant

This grant opportunity offers fire departments and non-affiliated Emergency Medical Service providers the chance to submit three grant applications. All three applications are due at the same time. The match for this grant is between 5% and 20% depending on your jurisdiction size. The maximum amount an applicant can apply for is \$1 million. *The 2014 application period is estimated to be open during October.* 

- Operations and Safety The Ops and Safety grant application can include requests for many things
  including training, equipment (rescue tools, ladders, hose, etc.), personal protective equipment (turnout
  gear, air packs, etc.), modifications to facilities (sprinkler systems, smoke and fire alarm systems, vehicle
  exhaust systems, etc.), and wellness/fitness programs (physicals, immunizations, health screenings,
  etc.).
- Vehicles Money for vehicles is limited to 25% of the total grant dollars available. Competition for vehicles is extremely competitive. Departments can apply for a pumper, tanker/tender, brush truck, aerial, or quint; depending what size your jurisdiction is. Fire departments can also request all the NFPA required equipment as part of their application. The age of the vehicle, age of the total fleet, and your call volume are taken into consideration for the competitive request.
- Regional Communication Projects Any eligible applicant, including fire departments or a nonaffiliated EMS organization, may act as a "host applicant" and apply for a communications project on behalf of itself and any number of organizations in neighboring jurisdictions. A regional project is one in which multiple organizations serving more than one local jurisdiction benefit directly from the activities implemented with the grant funds. Regional projects should be designed to facilitate interoperability and efficiency among the participating jurisdictions. Law enforcement can benefit from this grant. However, any equipment purchased with the grant must physically be distributed to all the departments in the identified region.

#### AFG – Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FPS)

FPS offers grants to support activities designed to reach high-risk target groups and mitigate incidences of death and injuries caused by fire and fire-related hazards. The match for this grant is between 5% and 20% depending on your jurisdiction size. Eligible projects include general education awareness (smoke alarms, sprinkler awareness, public education, juvenile fire setter projects, etc.), code enforcement and/or awareness, and fire and arson investigation. *The 2014 estimated application period is expected to be open in early winter.*

## **Affordable Housing Listening Sessions**

The Department of Administration's Division of Housing (DOH) is asking for input to help us serve Wisconsin's low to moderate income, homeless and special needs citizens. DOH will be holding **Public Input Sessions** throughout Wisconsin in the months of August and September. Public feedback is critical to the success of distributing approximately \$45 million each year for programs and new initiatives that help expand economic opportunities and affordable housing for some of our most vulnerable residents.

You can help us define our goals and prioritization of State and Federal U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds in the years ahead. The *Wisconsin 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan* defines how the State will distribute federal grant funds to local governments, public and private organizations, and businesses. More than 90% of these funds are HUD formula grants for:

- Small Cities Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)
- Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG)
- Housing Opportunities for Person with AIDS (HOPWA)

## **Wisconsin Land Information Program Update**

The Wisconsin Land Information Program (WLIP) at the Department of Administration (DOA) has made a commitment to engage stakeholders in the Statewide Parcel Map Initiative. Recently DOA sought feedback from the geospatial community on a document that outlines a planning process for the Parcel Initiative known as the *Statewide Parcel Map Initiative-Planning Process Framework*.

In letters from the community in response to the *Framework*, there was widespread support for the Strategic Initiative grant concept of allocating \$50k in annual WLIP strategic funding eligibility to the Land Information Office in each county (in addition to Base Budget grant funding), although no WLIP grant funding decisions have been finalized.

One suggestion DOA will enact is to form a Statewide Parcel Map Initiative advisory team. Over the course of the next year, DOA plans to engage the community at this and other points in the process, including but not limited to the following milestones:
