Schools Get \$15 Million for Broadband

Interested in broadband for your local school district? In December Governor Walker announced the availability of \$15 million for Technology for Educational **Ach**ievement (TEACH) Information Technology Infrastructure grants to assist districts to acquire equipment and services to build a modern technology system. The Department of Administration is now accepting applications from eligible school districts. Grant applications must be submitted by 11:59 PM on February 2nd. Recreational Boating Grants

Eligible applicants for this DNR funding opportunity include counties, towns, cities, villages, tribes, sanitary districts, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation districts, and qualified lake associations. Past projects have included ramps and service docks to gain access to water, acquisition of aquatic weed equipment, navigation aids, and dredging of waterway channels. Applications are accepted at any time. The next round is due February 1st. More details at dnr.wi.gov/aid/rbf.html.

Northwoods Freight Railroad Market Study

Studying Rail Service in Northern Wisconsin

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation along with SRF Consulting Group, is conducting the Northwoods Freight Rail Market Study. The study serves as an update to the 2013 Northwoods Freight Rail Market Study. This project will investigate the need for rail service in northern Wisconsin and the upper peninsula of Michigan. This is being accomplished through outreach with Northwoods Rail Transit Commission (NRTC) members, local economic development officials, business owners, rail users, and the operating railroads.

A survey of businesses in NRTC counties that currently use rail or have the potential to ship by rail concluded in December. Survey results and the final study will be available in March 2018.
