Got a Trail Cam? Snapshot Wisconsin Expands

The network of wildlife-monitoring trail cameras known as Snapshot Wisconsin, which has been operating in 26 counties, is now seeking volunteers to expand statewide.

Anyone with access to at least 10 contiguous acres of public or private land can apply to host a trail camera. Educators are welcome. No experience or special qualifications are necessary, aside from basic computer skills and internet access for uploading photos.

The DNR provides all training and supplies to volunteers upon acceptance into the program. Find out more at Snapshot Wisconsin.

Economic Development Hampered by Environmental Contamination?

The Wisconsin DNR offers two programs to local governments, tribes, non-profits, and other entities that are working to revitalize their communities, but whose projects are hampered by real or perceived environmental contamination.

The Wisconsin Assessment Monies

(WAM) program offers professional site investigation services—up to \$35,000—to communities where closed or closing industrial plants act as barriers to economic redevelopment. Awards through the WAM program do not require any match or administration, making them especially attractive to small towns and governments.

The Ready for Reuse program makes loans and grants available

for hazardous substance or petroleum cleanups at both small and large redevelopment sites throughout the state. There is no application deadline.

Funding for both programs is currently available and communities are encouraged to apply.

Credit Report Freezes Now Free

Under a new federal law, it is now free to place and lift credit freezes with the nationwide credit bureaus. Credit freezes restrict most access to your credit file, locking out identity thieves who may try to open new accounts in your name.

The new law also allows parents and legal guardians to freeze the credit file for a child under age 16; extends fraud alerts from 90 days to one year; and requires the credit reporting bureaus to provide free electronic credit monitoring to all active duty military members within the next year.

Healthy Lakes Grants



Now is the time to start planning for Healthy Lakes grants. Local governments are eligible for this funding to protect and

improve our lakes, and can apply on behalf of individual lakeshore property owners. The funding covers \$1,000 per best practice, including fish sticks, native plantings, and rain gardens. Best practices can be packaged into a single grant application up to \$25,000. Public property is eligible for the funding, too, and makes for a great demonstration opportunity.

VITA and TCE volunteers help ensure that seniors, lower-income taxpayers, veterans, and military personnel have access to free tax preparation services by knowledgeable individuals at more than 200 sites across Wisconsin.

Wisconsin needs volunteers to participate in these important programs. They are open to anyone and may be of particular interest to those who like math or have a background in accounting, finance, or economics. Training usually takes place in January and February, and the site coordinator determines dates and times.
