## STATE OF WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION PUBLIC NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF A MULTI-DISCHARGER VARIANCE PACKAGE

Brief Description: This proposed renewal of Wisconsin's phosphorus multi-discharger variance (MDV) is designed to continue providing a tool for industries and municipalities facing restrictive phosphorus compliance costs. In exchange for extending the timeline for complying with low-level phosphorus limits, point sources commit to stepwise reductions of phosphorus within their effluent while addressing nonpoint sources of phosphorus from farm fields, cities or natural areas. This draft MDV package provides the technical justification and the proposed implementation strategy for this variance. EPA approval is required before the MDV would continue to be available to WPDES permit holders. If approved, WPDES permit holders will be required to go through site specific evaluations prior to being able to utilize the MDV.

Wisconsin's MDV was initially approved by EPA on February 6, 2017. The MDV was approved for an initial 10-year period, expiring in February of 2027. Roughly 160 WPDES permittees have utilized the MDV to avoid economic hardship and make stepwise phosphorus reductions in effluent and nonpoint sources. Section 283.16 (3) of the Wisconsin Statues outlines the MDV reauthorization process relative to the determination that phosphorus effluent limits result in substantial and widespread adverse social and economic impacts.
