#### JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Minutes of the Meeting Under s. 13.10

December 17, 2009

Co-chair Pocan presided and called the meeting to order at 10:18 a.m.

Present: Senators Miller, Hansen, Taylor, Lehman, Robson, Lassa, Darling Representatives Pocan, Colón, Mason, Shilling, Sherman, Grigsby, Vos, Montgomery

Absent: Senator Olsen

#### I. Department of Employee Trust Funds

Moved by Senator Miller and seconded by Representative Pocan to approve the department's request for a supplement of \$488,500 SEG in fiscal year 2009-10 and \$671,500 SEG in fiscal year 2010-11 and 4.0 FTE SEG positions annually to its administration appropriation account under s. 20.515(1)(w). The supplement would be provided from the Committee's supplemental appropriation for segregated funds under s. 20.865(4)(u), with funds drawn from the available balances of the Public Employee Trust Fund.

#### II. Department of Public Instruction

Moved by Senator Miller and seconded by Representative Pocan to approve the request to transfer \$2,313,400 GPR in fiscal year 2009-10 from the Committee's appropriation [s. 20.865(4)(a)] to the pupil assessment appropriation [s. 20.255(1)(dw)]. Under this motion, pupil assessment funding would equal \$5,419,900 GPR in fiscal year 2009-10 and \$3,106,500 GPR in fiscal year 2010-11. The department could submit another request to the Committee for the release of the remaining \$2,313,400 GPR in fiscal year 2010-11.

#### III. Department of Administration

Moved by Representative Vos and seconded by Senator Darling to deny the request to approve the "Stripper XXII" oil overcharge expenditure plan dated September 11, 2009, as proposed by the Governor to allocate the expenditure of \$602,907.78 FED (plus certain accrued interest and future interest amounts) of both new and reprogrammed oil overcharge restitution funds.

Ayes, 3; Noes, 12 (Pocan, Colón, Mason, Shilling, Sherman, Grigsby, Miller, Hansen, Taylor, Lehman, Robson, Lassa); Absent, 1 (Olsen)

Moved by Senator Miller and seconded by Representative Pocan to approve the "Stripper XXII" oil overcharge expenditure plan dated September 11, 2009, as proposed by the Governor to allocate the expenditure of \$602,907.78 FED (plus certain accrued interest and future interest amounts) of both new and reprogrammed oil overcharge restitution funds for the following: (a) \$300,000 FED for a Consortium for Clean Energy Generation, Transmission and Storage Systems; (b) \$287,611.14 for the Center for Renewable Energy Systems at UW-Madison to research renewable energy technologies; and (c) \$15,296.64 plus all accruing interest from Stripper XXII for energy programs management within the department's Division of Energy Services. In addition, specify that funding for the University of Wisconsin projects be provided under the UW-System's PR-continuing fund transfers from other state agencies appropriation [s. 20.285(1)(k) of the statutes] in fiscal year 2009-10.

Moved by Senator Lassa and seconded by Senator Hansen to require the University of Wisconsin System to report by December 31, 2010, and December 31, 2011, to the Joint Committee on Finance on the following: (1) the use of funding to date for Consortium for Clean Energy Generation, Transmission and Storage Systems and Center for Renewable Energy Systems; (2) a complete budget for Consortium for Clean Energy Generation, Transmission and Storage Systems and Center for Renewable Energy Systems; and (3) efforts to collaborate between UW System institutions and private businesses.

#### IV. Department of Transportation

Moved by Senator Miller and seconded by Representative Pocan to approve the Governor's request, as amended, to provide \$8,830,634 in federal ARRA funds to fund the nonurban transit projects identified by local transit providers. In addition, approve the Governor's amended request to identify \$2,585,533 in nonurban transit projects on a contingency list of projects that could be submitted to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to fully utilize federal nonurban transit ARRA funds. Finally, approve the Governor's request to identify \$3,774,229 in small urban transit projects on a second contingency list of projects that could be submitted to FTA to fully utilize federal nonurban transit ARRA funds.
