Dear Senator Darling and Representative Nygren:

Attached are the signed minutes of the July 16, 2015, meeting under s. 13.10, Wisconsin Statutes.

Pursuant to s. 13.10(4), Wisconsin Statutes, I am objecting to the Committee's action under one item of the minutes.

Under item II, paragraph 3, the Joint Committee on Finance required the Department of Transportation to transfer \$3,000,000 SEG in fiscal year 2014-15 from its routine maintenance activities, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(es) to its highway system management and operations, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq). The Joint Committee on Finance also provided a supplement of \$12,885,100 SEG to the appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq) from the unappropriated balance of the transportation fund.

I object to item II, paragraph 3, as it relates to transferring \$3,000,000 SEG from the routine maintenance activities, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(es) to the highway system management and operations, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq).

The 2013-15 biennial budget, 2013 Wisconsin Act 20, separated funding for county-performed maintenance on state highways and other maintenance activities on state highways into two appropriations and permitted the Department of Transportation to work with counties on alternate contracting methods for county-performed maintenance. In working with the counties, the department developed a performance based maintenance program that will be used to pilot more efficient methods for performing state highway maintenance. I am concerned that transferring \$3,000,000 SEG out of the appropriation used to reimburse counties for performing

state highway maintenance may result in insufficient funding for this new performance-based maintenance program.

As a result of this veto, I am requesting the Department of Administration secretary not to transfer \$3,000,000 SEG from the routine maintenance activities, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(es) to the highway system management and operations, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq) and instead provide a supplement of \$15,885,100 SEG in fiscal year 2014-15 to the appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq) from the unappropriated balance of the transportation fund.

Minutes of the Meeting under s. 13.10

July 16, 2015

Co-chair Nygren presided and called the meeting to order.

Present: Senators Darling, Olsen, Harsdorf, Vukmir, Tiffany, Marklein, L. Taylor, Erpenbach

I. Department of Corrections

Moved by Representative Nygren and seconded by Senator Darling to approve the Department of Corrections' request of a one-time transfer of \$11,137,800 GPR in fiscal year 2014-15, including \$3,044,000 GPR from its corrections contracts and agreements appropriation under s. 20.410(1)(ab), \$3,100,000 GPR from its services for drunken driving offenders appropriation under s. 20.410(1)(bd), \$4,793,800 GPR from its energy costs; energy-related assessments appropriation under s. 20.410(1)(f), and \$200,000 GPR from its serious juvenile offenders appropriation under s. 20.410(3)(cg), to its general program operations appropriation under s. 20.410(1)(a) to maintain health services at the department's adult correctional institutions.

II. Department of Transportation

Moved by Senator Erpenbach and seconded by Senator L. Taylor to approve the Department of Transportation's request of a one-time supplement of \$15,885,100 SEG in fiscal year 2014-15 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(u) to the department's highway system management and operations, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq) to cover expenditures for salt used on state highways, signage for the conversion of U.S. Highway 41 to Interstate Highway 41, signage for the increase of the maximum state speed limit to 70 miles per hour, and other nondeferrable highway maintenance and repairs.

Additionally, stipulate that the approval of future requests for maintenance funding under s. 13.10 is contingent upon the department's submission of quarterly reports to the Committee regarding the fiscal status of the routine maintenance and highway system management and operations appropriations. Specify that these reports include the following information: (a) a summary of the department's planned expenditures from these appropriations through the end of the current fiscal year; (b) estimates of the current and anticipated ending balances of these appropriations in the current fiscal year; and (c) a list of any anticipated, unfunded maintenance activities and the related costs for which the department believes it will need funding in excess of annually appropriated amounts in the current fiscal year. Require that these reports be submitted to the Committee no later than 10 business days following the first day of each quarter of the fiscal year, beginning with the report due in October 2015.

Moved by Representative Nygren and seconded by Senator Darling to modify the Department of Transportation's request for a supplement of \$15,885,100 SEG and instead transfer \$3,000,000 SEG from the unencumbered balance in the routine maintenance activities, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(es) to the highway system management and operations, state funds appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(eq) and fund the remainder of the department's request (\$12,885,100) from the unappropriated balance of the transportation fund.

Additionally, stipulate that the approval of future requests for maintenance funding under s. 13.10 is contingent upon the department's submission of biannual reports to the Committee regarding the fiscal status of the routine maintenance and highway system management and operations appropriations. Specify that these reports include the following information: (a) a summary of the department's planned expenditures from these appropriations through the end of the current fiscal year; (b) estimates of the current and anticipated ending balances of these appropriations in the current fiscal year; and (c) a list of any anticipated, unfunded maintenance activities and the related costs for which the department believes it will need funding in excess of annually appropriated amounts in the current fiscal year. Require that these reports be submitted to the Committee no later than 10 business days following the first day of the second and fourth quarters of the fiscal year, beginning with the report due in October 2015.

IV. Department of Natural Resources

Moved by Representative C. Taylor and seconded by Senator L. Taylor to approve the Department of Natural Resources' request to obligate up to \$532,800 in fiscal year 2014-2015 stewardship program land acquisition funds for the purchase of two parcels of railroad right-of-way from Wisconsin Central Limited (a subsidiary of Canadian National Railway Company), including a parcel of approximately 71 acres totaling \$283,700 for the Devil's River State Trail in Manitowoc County, and a parcel of approximately 14 acres for \$249,100 for the Wild Rivers State Trail in Barron County.

Moved by Representative Loudenbeck and seconded by Senator Olsen to approve the Department of Natural Resources' request, but to specify that the department may obligate no more than \$401,900 (a 25 percent discount of \$532,800) in fiscal year 2014-2015 stewardship program land acquisition funds for the purchase of two parcels of railroad right-of-way from Wisconsin Central Limited (a subsidiary of Canadian National Railway Company), including a parcel of approximately 71 acres for the Devil's River State Trail in Manitowoc County, and a parcel of approximately 14 acres for the Wild Rivers State Trail in Barron County.
