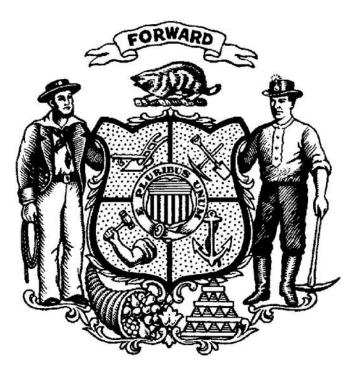

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AGENCY DESCRIPTION

The department was created by Chapter 479, Laws of 1929. The department is overseen by a ninemember board, including two consumer representatives, appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate for staggered six-year terms.

The Governor appoints a secretary, with the advice and consent of the Senate, to administer the department.

The Office of the Secretary includes the secretary, deputy secretary and assistant deputy secretary. The department's general legal counsel, legislative liaison and communications director are attached to the Office of the Secretary.

The department's programs are administered through six divisions: Food and Recreational Safety, Trade and Consumer Protection, Animal Health, Agricultural Development, Agricultural Resource Management, and Management Services.

The Veterinary Examining Board is administratively attached to the department.

The Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection was created by Chapter 479, Laws of 1929. The department is overseen by a nine member board, including two consumer representatives, appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate for staggered six-year terms. The Governor appoints a secretary to administer the department. The mission of the department is to partner with all the citizens of Wisconsin to grow the economy by promoting quality food, healthy plants and animals, sound use of land and water resources, and a fair marketplace. The department's programs are administered through six divisions.

1. The **Division of Food and Recreational Safety** protects the state's food supply from farm to table, through oversight of food production, processing, distribution and sale. The Division also ensures the safe operation of lodging establishments (hotels, bed-and-breakfast operations, tourist rooming houses), pools and water attractions, campgrounds, and recreational / educational camps.

2. The **Division of Trade and Consumer Protection** has broad authority to ensure fair business practices between buyers and sellers, which encourages confidence in the marketplace. The division inspects grain, fruit, and vegetables. The division regulates fuel quality and the storage of flammable material.

3. The **Division of Animal Health** is responsible for the prevention, diagnosis, and control of animal disease. The goal is to protect animal and human health and to prevent losses to livestock and animal industries. The division employs several tools to achieve this goal, including animal health and disease programs, animal disease response, and proactive education.

4. The **Division of Agricultural Development** serves and strengthens the state's agricultural industry businesses to innovate, expand and thrive, through one on one consultations, referrals to expert technical assistance with public and private providers, marketing and financial assistance through grant programs funded by federal and state resources.

5. The **Division of Agricultural Resource Management** works to protect Wisconsin's land, water, and plant resources in partnership with agricultural stakeholders in the face of a changing climate. This includes safeguarding the human and animal food supply and the resources that support it; regulating pesticides and agricultural chemicals to protect public, animal, and plant health; working with industry and farmers to prevent agricultural chemical spills and to clean up contaminated spill sites; helping landowners and local governments to conserve Wisconsin's productive land and water resources; helping to preserve farmland; preventing plant pests and diseases to protect the state's environment and economy; and certifying plant product exports to maintain and expand trade markets.

6. The **Division of Management Services** provides central administrative services to the agency's divisions and staff. The division handles information technology, telecommunications, and data security; budget development, procurement, and financial management; and laboratory testing services for various department programs. The division also coordinates agency-wide responsibilities, such as employee and workplace safety, emergency and incident response coordination, and fleet management.

The Office of the Secretary includes the secretary, deputy secretary and assistant deputy secretary. Attached directly to the secretary's office are the general legal counsel, legislative liaison and communications director.

The Veterinary Examining Board is administratively attached to the department and supported by personnel in the Animal Health Division.

PROGRAM	01	Food Safety and Consumer Protection

The Division of Food and Recreational Safety and the Division of Trade and Consumer Protection perform important functions that safeguard Wisconsin consumers.

The Division of Food and Recreational Safety is the state's primary food regulatory division. Division programs safeguard consumers' physical and economic health. The Division of Food and Recreational Safety enforces state statutes and regulations governing the food supply from the farm to the consumer.

The division has food inspection, dairy inspection, laboratory certification, grade A milk certification and meat and poultry inspection programs. The division licenses and inspects over 20,000 food, lodging, and recreational businesses. These include food processing plants, grocery stores, convenience stores, restaurants, food warehouses, hotels, tourist rooming houses, bed and breakfast businesses, public pools and water attractions, campgrounds, and recreational/educational camps. The division also works with local governments to perform these functions. Local health departments in 60 cities, counties, and multi-jurisdiction consortia work as agents for the division.

The division licenses and inspects approximately 5,500 dairy farms and nearly 4,000 other dairy-related businesses and personnel, such as dairy plants, receiving/transfer stations, bulk milk weigher-samplers, and bulk milk tankers. The division also inspects roughly 224 licensed meat establishments and roughly 67 custom-exempt meat slaughter or processing operations. Related to these inspections Wisconsin participates in the USDA Cooperative Interstate Shipment (CIS) program, which allows selected and approved state-inspected establishments to ship certain products wholesale across state lines

Laboratory analyses serve an important function in ensuring the safety of food, dairy products, and water supplies throughout Wisconsin. The division certifies food, dairy, and water laboratories and the analysts working in these laboratories. These labs perform microbiological and drug residue analyses on food, milk and water.

The Division of Trade and Consumer Protection has primary responsibility for Wisconsin's laws that ensure a fair marketplace for buyers and sellers, including buyers and sellers of agricultural commodities. The division's statutory authority to prohibit unfair trade practices by rule forms the cornerstone of the state's general trade regulation and consumer protection programs. The division's responsibilities include administration and enforcement of laws regulating deceptive advertising, consumer product safety, and consumer fraud. The division administers the statewide consumer protection hotline and Wisconsin's Do Not Call program.

The division also educates and assists victims of identity theft. The goals are to help the public deter, detect, and prevent identity theft. The division also educates law enforcement about identity theft and businesses on the importance of protecting personal data in their possession. The division provides free presentations to a wide range of groups including business and professional organizations, seniors, students, military members, and general consumers on topics such as: current scams and fraud, home improvement, general consumer protection, and landlord/tenant issues.

The division regulates many commercial transactions, including apartment and manufactured home site rentals, telecommunications consumer contracts, auto repairs, and home improvements.

The division enforces state laws requiring accurate weights and measures for all commodities, as well as ensuring that fuel meets minimum standards. The division protects the health and safety of the public through its regulation of storage tank systems used for flammable and combustible materials.

Trade practices are regulated to protect and to promote fair and open competition in the marketplace. The division's trade practices programs include the regulation of discriminatory sale practices. In order to protect agricultural producers from fraud and devastating financial defaults, division auditors monitor the financial condition and business practices of dairy plants, grain elevators, and vegetable processing plants.

In cooperation with USDA, the division's commodity inspection programs include grading, inspecting, weighing and certification of grain, fruits and vegetable products. The goal of these inspection programs is to allow buyers to purchase with confidence by assuring an accurate representation of product quality, condition, size, and compliance with grade and labeling standards and export requirements.

PROGRAM	02	Animal Health Services

The Division of Animal Health is responsible for the prevention, diagnosis, and control of animal disease. The goal is to protect animal and human health and to prevent losses to livestock and animal industries. The division employs several tools to achieve this goal, including animal health and disease programs, animal disease response, and proactive education. The division also supports the Veterinary Examining Board (VEB).

The division manages several animal health and disease programs. The division licenses animal markets, animal dealers, animal truckers, feedlots, deer farms and fish farms to assist with disease control and animal traceability. These entities are required to keep records of livestock movement, including official identification of animals. The division requires that a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) accompany all animals imported into the state. The division manages disease certification programs, which make it easier for owners to sell and move animals intra- and interstate. The division also manages a dog sellers program, which establishes minimum facility and care requirements.

The division is responsible for animal disease response. When a disease of concern is identified, the division implements quarantines and conducts epidemiological investigations to trace the disease to its place of origin and to other potentially infected premises. The division administers the livestock premises registration program through a contract with the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium, which significantly enhances the division's ability to respond rapidly to a disease outbreak. The ability to trace animal movements rapidly is essential to containing and eradicating disease threats and protecting export markets for animals and animal products.

Another component of the division's mission is to provide education and guidance to the public and affected industries. The division's veterinary program managers frequently meet with private veterinarians, members of animal industries, and local units of government to discuss program changes, diseases of concern, and disease reporting. The division provides chronic wasting disease sampler certification training, humane officer training, and rabies control trainings. The division also provides expertise and guidance as needed regarding the humane handling of animals.

The division also provides support to the VEB, which was transferred to the agency and division from the Department of Safety and Professional Services. The division provides support for licensing of veterinarians, certification of veterinary technicians, veterinary complaint investigation, disciplinary monitoring, administrative rule proposals, and communications and outreach with industry.

The Division of Agricultural Development works in partnership with the state's agricultural industry and others to support and increase resilience for Wisconsin's agricultural sector. Its programs are administered to provide services across a continuum of business development, from the farm to value added processing, to the final product sale at the local, regional or international level. The goal of the division is to help grow Wisconsin agriculture by providing business and market development services.

Agricultural development services include economic development assistance to stimulate the growth of Wisconsin agriculture, and strengthen/increase markets for Wisconsin-grown food, agricultural products and services. Services offered to growers, processors, retailers, distributors and purchasing institutions include market development analysis, direct technical consulting, referrals to public and private resources at the state and national levels, producer development support, distribution guidance, processing expertise and branding/marketing support programs. This assistance helps inform decisions regarding profitability, expansion, transition planning and product development supporting Wisconsin's diverse agriculture and food producers and processors.

The division provides grants to dairy processing plants to support research, planning, and assistance for dairy industry growth. In addition, grants are made to meat processing plants to grow the meat industry. The Farm to School program works with stakeholder groups to provide education and identify barriers in providing local foods in schools. The Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin program increases awareness and consumption of locally produced products to increase the production and improve distribution for local consumption. This is accomplished by strengthening relationships between producer networks, processors and distributors and retailers, institutions, and consumers. Non-profit organizations, producer organizations, government agencies, universities and other agricultural groups can apply for the USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant Program funds. The division administers these funds and seeks applicants that will enhance the competitiveness of Wisconsin's specialty crop industries.

Division staff assist organic farmers and processors develop and expand market share for local products by engaging with a broad network of stakeholders, including food production companies, agricultural associations, food processors, distributors, wholesalers, retailers, etc. Staff provide industry stakeholders with market development assistance, research, technical seminars, one-on-one business development consultation and administer the Organic Cost Share Program to help farmers and processors pay for organic certification.

The international agribusiness team promotes the export of the state's agricultural and agribusiness products to foreign markets by providing technical assistance, including exporter education, market analysis, market development, access to federal market expansion funding, and organizing and participating in trade shows and missions to foreign markets. The team builds partnerships with foreign business leaders and governments to enhance trade and grow Wisconsin agriculture through increased exports.

The division manages a crisis hotline for distressed farmers, providing referral services for financial consulting and social services. Volunteer farm credit advisors mediate debtor/creditor and contract issues and other concerns. The farm mediation program works with farmers to resolve disputes. The Rural Electric Power Services program and Herd Health Diagnostics work cooperatively with the Wisconsin Public Service Commission, farmers and rural electric providers to investigate and resolve herd health concerns including stray voltage issues.

The Something Special *from* Wisconsin[™] program promotes products and commodities produced or manufactured in the state to registered companies and organizations. Alice in Dairyland is Wisconsin's agricultural ambassador and her mission is to support agricultural business by educating the public about the vital role agriculture plays in the economy, environment and quality of life in Wisconsin. Throughout

the year Alice participates in industry trainings, speaks at community events, maintains a social media presence and plans media campaigns to share that knowledge with consumers. Several industry partners collaborate closely with the Alice in Dairyland program.

The division supports Marketing Orders by auditing commodity check off funds, managing elections and assessments of the seven agricultural commodity boards in the state. The division administers the cultivated ginseng program by licensing growers and dealers and managing the distribution of ginseng sales certificates. The division also provides support to over seventy county and district fairs across the state.

PROGRAM 04	Agricultural Assistance

The agricultural assistance program encourages and develops public interest in agriculture through education and stimulating innovation in Wisconsin's agriculture industry.

Targeted state aid is provided to:

- Over seventy county and district fairs for exhibitor premium payments.
- The World Dairy Expo to expand business opportunities for people in the dairy industry.
- The Wisconsin Farm Bureau to provide public schools with agricultural educational materials.

State aid also funds grant programs such as the:

- Dairy Processor grant program to promote the growth of the dairy industry through research, planning, and assistance.
- Buy Local, Buy Wisconsin grants that are awarded to individuals or organizations to fund projects to increase the sale of local agricultural products.
- Export Expansion grants that aim to accelerate the growth of Wisconsin dairy, meat, and crop product exports.
- Meat Processor Infrastructure grant program that strives to grow Wisconsin's meat industry and improve the long-term viability of the livestock sector.
- Tribal Elder Community Food Box Program that provides grants to nonprofit food assistance organizations for the purpose of purchasing and distributing food to tribal elders and for the purpose of supporting the growth and operations of food producers participating in the program.

The Division of Agricultural Resource Management performs numerous functions relating to soil and water conservation, farmland preservation, livestock siting, plant health, the safe handling of fertilizers and pesticides, and the safe disposal of household hazardous waste.

The division is responsible for activities related to farmland preservation and soil and water conservation. The division's land and water team reviews county agricultural preservation plans, land and water resource management (LWRM) plans, petitions for designation of Agricultural Enterprise Areas (AEAs), and exclusive agricultural zoning ordinances, and analyzes the impacts of public projects on farmland. They are responsible for development and implementation of nutrient management standards for the state. The division staffs the Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Board whose duties include making recommendations regarding approval of county LWRM plans and annual allocation plans that award grants to counties and others. The division also provides staff support for the Livestock Facility Siting Review Board.

The division provides oversight and support for local programs related to agricultural performance standards, livestock siting standards, and drainage districts. The division support for local programs includes annual grants to counties to fund county staff and landowner cost-sharing projects, grants to producer-led watershed protection groups, as well as statewide conservation engineering assistance provided by field staff.

The division works to control serious plant pests, diseases and exotic species that threaten Wisconsin's crops, forests and plant communities. The division also works to control honeybee diseases and pests. Staff use quarantine and treatment programs, as necessary, to control major pests such as spongy moth and Emerald Ash Borer. The division also inspects bee colonies, lumber, nursery stock and agricultural crops to certify that they are free of diseases and destructive pests. This facilitates the interstate and international movement of agricultural commodities. The division also issues phytosanitary certificates which are required for all agricultural plant exports. The division licenses and inspects nursery growers and dealers, Christmas tree growers and seed labelers. The division also conducts pest surveys across the state to evaluate pest pressure on various crops. The division publishes a weekly pest survey bulletin that goes out to the agricultural community during the growing season and is a tool to aid them in their profitability.

The division is also responsible for the regulation of pesticide storage, handling, application, and disposal to minimize potential exposure and harm to persons, property, and the environment. The division directs clean-up of pesticide and fertilizer spills and administers the Agricultural Chemical Clean-Up Program. The division administers regulations that set standards for the bulk storage of pesticides and fertilizers, and assures that products including animal feed, fertilizer, pesticides, soil and plant additives and agricultural lime are correctly labeled and free from adulteration. The division also licenses manufacturers and distributors of these products and also licenses and certifies pesticide applicators through an examination process. The division is responsible for carrying out inspections, investigations, and enforcement activities related to the above programs. This includes investigation of groundwater contamination by pesticide, complaints of damage or harm to persons, property or the environment resulting from pesticide misuse, and toxic response incidents involving livestock. The division also provides funding and technical support to municipalities for the collection and disposal of waste pesticides and household hazardous wastes (including unwanted prescription drugs).

This program includes the Office of the Secretary, the Division of Management Services, and the Wisconsin Agricultural Statistics Service (WASS).

The Division of Management Services provides central administrative services to the department. The division is responsible for agencywide services including budget development, procurement, accounting, and financial management; information technology, data security, and geographic information services; laboratory services provided to the other divisions and other state agencies; and general services related to: incident/emergency response, employee and workplace safety, and fleet management.

WASS houses a cooperative partnership between the USDA-National Agricultural Statistics Services (NASS) and DATCP. The goal of the program is to provide important, usable, and accurate statistical agricultural information necessary to evaluate agriculture and provide for sound decision making.

MISSION

The mission of the department is to partner with all the citizens of Wisconsin to grow the economy by promoting quality food, healthy plants and animals, sound use of land and water resources, and a fair marketplace.

PROGRAMS, GOALS, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Program 1: Food Safety and Consumer Protection

Goal: Ensure fair business practices for buyers and sellers and, the sale of safe products, including food, for consumers and the environment by establishing and enforcing legal standards, by mediating disputes between consumers and businesses, and by providing consumer education and information to Wisconsin citizens.

Objective/Activity: Educate and empower stakeholders and the general public through outreach and educational efforts, mediating disputes, and enforcing legal standards to increase compliance with laws and rules.

Program 3: Agricultural Development Services

Goal: Serve and strengthen the state's agricultural industry. Help producers and processors to innovate, expand, and thrive through one-on-one consultations, referrals to technical assistance through public and private providers, and provide financial support through grant programs funded by federal and state sources.

Objective/Activity: Increase sales of Wisconsin's agricultural products locally, regionally and internationally through educational programs, producer development, market analysis, market development and business development.

Program 7: Agricultural Resource Management

Goal: Improve environmental, public health, plant and livestock protection in Wisconsin while allowing for the efficacious and wise use of fertilizer, pesticide and other agrichemical materials.

Objective/Activity: Allow Wisconsin farmers, businesses and homes to safely and conveniently dispose of unwanted pesticides and other hazardous chemicals, including unwanted prescription drugs, at public collection sites.

Program 8: Central Administrative Services

Goal: Provide information, advice, expertise, and service to support the department's mission and the business needs of its programs and staff.

Objective/Activity: Resolve technology issues reported through the department's IT Help Desk in a timely manner.

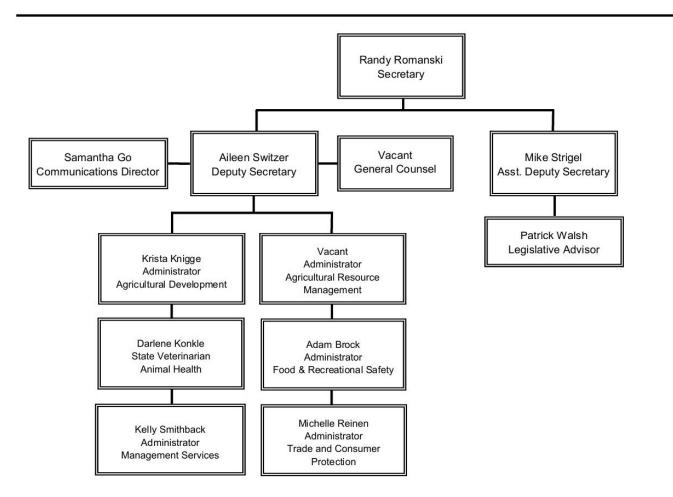

NARRATIVE

The department requests 4.0 FTE meat safety inspector-entry project positions. The 2.0 GPR FTE and 2.0 FED FTE are needed to continue providing meat inspection and sampling services at meat establishments.

Meat Inspection Program Staff

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4001

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests 4.0 FTE (2.0 GPR FTE, 2.0 PR-F FTE) meat safety inspector-entry project positions. The 2021-23 budget created 4.0 FTE meat safety inspector-entry project positions which are expiring June 30, 2025. The department also requests \$116,600 GPR and \$116,600 FED in FY26 and \$155,400 GPR and \$155,400 FED in FY27 to fund the 4.0 FTE meat and safety inspector-entry project positions.

Analysis:

2021 Wisconsin Act 58, the biennial budget, approved 4.0 FTE meat safety inspector-entry project positions for the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection's (DATCP) Division of Food and Recreational Safety (DFRS). The positions expire June 30, 2025.

The ongoing need for these meat inspector positions is due to the ongoing success in slaughter and meat processing across the State. Meat inspectors are responsible for the inspection of the entire meat processing effort at a slaughter facility. This ensures that both state and federal requirements for the safe handling of these food products are met.

DATCP's ability to provide meat inspection services would be reduced if these positions are not approved. Providing fewer inspections would unnecessarily put public health at risk.

In recent years, the meat inspection program has lost ground in executing its mission to complete 100% of its daily inspection obligations, declining from over 95% in 2019 and 2020, to less than 92% over the last 12 months. If the department is unable to fill positions, that means processing inspections could be delayed, meaning the industry's meat establishments are delayed in processing animals – thereby potentially impacting the state's meat industry and economy.

Wisconsin is home to a robust meat processing industry with 522 federal and state inspected meat establishments. With the increased support and emphasis on building this industry via the 2019-2021 biennial budget and use of federal relief funds, the department anticipates continued interest, entrepreneurship, and investment into the meat industry. Due to the ongoing need for this work, the department feels that it is necessary to maintain staff levels to prevent a reduction in the ability to provide meat inspection services.

NARRATIVE

The department requests \$541,400 GPR annually to match FED expenditures and to continue providing meat inspection and sampling services at meat establishments.

Meat Inspection Program Funding

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4002

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests \$541,400 GPR in FY26 and FY27 to match FED expenditures and to continue providing meat inspection and sampling services at meat establishments. The 2023-25 budget provided one-time funding of \$541,400 GPR in FY25.

Analysis:

Annually, DATCP enters into a cooperative agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to conduct meat and poultry inspections in 225 Wisconsin-licensed meat establishments. With the cooperative agreement comes an award of federal funding and the need to match the direct expenses charged to the federal funds, dollar for dollar.

Maintaining the responsibilities defined in the cooperative agreement is a health and safety measure for the State of Wisconsin. The inspections conducted as part of the agreement ensure meat is being properly handled as it makes its way from farm to table.

Our state can be proud of the animal herds and quality of the meat products it produces thanks to the dedicated farmers and processors throughout Wisconsin. For this reason, DATCP is not looking to reduce the services or regulations currently in place for this vital program. Being able to identify concerns and issues prior to products being processed and sold is a benefit to farmers, processors, retailers, and consumers. It is imperative that the program be able to operate at least at current capacity.

To do so, however, it is necessary for the department to request an increase in its GPR funding.

Appropriation s. 20.115 (1)(a), general program operations (numeric 10200), is used, in part, to match the federal funding provided. In SFY2025, the department's GPR allotment in s. 20.115 (1)(a) is \$5,827,800. If the one-time funding is not continued, this would be a 9.3% reduction in the allotment. This action would cause significant hardship in the ability of the department to provide necessary services and to meet the FED match requirements. Work in the meat inspection program is ongoing. In fact, in recent years, the program has lost ground in executing its mission to complete 100% of its daily inspection obligations, declining from over 95% in 2019 and 2020, to less than 92% over the last 12 months due to recruitment and retention challenges.

The department is charged with ensuring the health and safety of Wisconsin citizens. Continuing to operate the meat and poultry inspections program is critical to meeting this charge. To do so, the Department requires sufficient matching funds. Additional GPR in the amount of \$541,400 on the supplies and services allotment line will help to maintain operations of the program. [It should be noted that the federal government has not been meeting its fair share of the cooperative agreement and additional state funding beyond this request could be necessary to backfill this gap.]

Without a budget increase in s. 20.115 (1)(a) general program operations (numeric 10200), it is unclear how the department will meet its obligations under the cooperative agreement with the federal government.

NARRATIVE

The department requests \$300,000 GPR annually above base level funding to continue current assistance provided to the Dairy Processing Plant Grant program.

Dairy Processing Plant Grant Program

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4003

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests an increase of \$300,000 GPR in FY26 and FY27 for a total of \$500,000 GPR ongoing annually for the Dairy Processing Plant Grant program. The 2023-25 budget provided an increase of \$300,000 GPR per year on a one-time basis, bringing the total Dairy Processing Plant Grant program funding to \$1,000,000 GPR during the 2023-25 biennium.

Analysis:

Ninety percent of Wisconsin's milk is made into cheese, generating economic activity, and supporting the agricultural supply chain in Wisconsin. From 2014-2021, Dairy Processing Plant grant recipients reported spending an additional \$1,189,659.15 in matching funds for \$1,300,000 in grant awards received over that seven-year period.

The Dairy Processing Plant Grant program funds projects which expand dairy processing plants, advance processor innovations, improve production and profitability and fund staff training on food safety requirements. Eligible dairy processors include cheese, butter, and ice cream makers as well as those that process fluid milk, yogurt, and whey and milk products. All sizes of processors in the state – from small, local creameries to companies and cooperatives marketing products around the world have received Dairy Processing Plant Grants.

DATCP continues to receive applications for funding exceeding the base level of \$200,000 – further documenting the industry need. The table below demonstrates the unmet need to support an increase in funding.

NARRATIVE

The department requests \$100,000 GPR annually to continue providing mental health assistance to farmers.

Farmer Mental Health Assistance

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4004

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests \$100,000 GPR annually to continue providing mental health assistance to farmers. The 2023-25 budget provided one-time funding of \$100,000 in both FY24 and FY25.

Analysis:

Continuing DATCP's Farmer Wellness Program is key to helping Wisconsin farm families access mental health support to reduce stress and improve wellbeing. Funding will sustain its counseling voucher program, tele-counseling services, 24/7 Farmer Wellness Helpline, and online support groups. These services breakdown barriers and reduce stigma by giving farmers service options based on their unique situations.

USDA is anticipating a drop of 25.5% of net farm income in 2024. Unpredictable income is a top stressor identified by Wisconsin farmers. The Farmer Wellness Program continues to see growth and usage rates at all-time highs. For example, counseling voucher redemptions in our last fiscal year have surpassed our previous all-time yearly high. Unfortunately, it continues to be commonly reported that farmers are at an elevated risk of death by suicide compared to other U.S. occupational groups.

DATCP Farmer Mental Health Assistance Program:

Since launching the Farmer Wellness Program in early FY21, DATCP's focus has been to encourage farmers to prioritize mental health, increase affordability, accessibility, and availability of professional services. Looking at FY24 data, the program shows continued growth and many services are being utilized at all-time highs. The 24/7 Helpline had 558 calls for immediate support, an increase of 106% as compared to FY23 which demonstrates strong demand by Wisconsin farmers. Over 55 tele-counseling sessions were conducted with farmers and farm family members. Due to convenience, time savings, and the ability to reach farmers uncomfortable with in-person counseling, tele-counseling is believed to be an opportunity for expanded growth in the upcoming year.

Analyzing the more long-standing counseling voucher program, 444 vouchers were redeemed, with an estimated redemption rate of over 93%. This all-time high redemption rate demonstrates that, when farmers receive counseling vouchers, they are more likely than ever before to use them and receive mental health support.

In FY24, the department utilized the \$100,000 to directly fund counseling services including the 24/7 Helpline, tele-counseling, and in-person counseling vouchers as well as an LTE to administer the Farmer Wellness Program. Additional resources made available as part of the state's investment in farmer mental health assistance include online farmer support groups, the

Rural Realities podcast, targeted outreach and educational activities. Participation in online farmer support groups was up over 20% compared to FY23. The Rural Realities podcast library contains 27 episodes with over 3,050 cumulative downloads. Targeted outreach and educational activities helped increase awareness and usage of Farmer Wellness Program services and increase the likelihood that, when a farmer is in need, the Farmer Wellness Program is one of the first calls they make.

Even with all these service improvements, there is more program development that can be done to provide resources to farmers. Healthy Wisconsin farmers lead to healthy agricultural businesses adding value to the State's economy. With ongoing funding, the department will continue to make available, build upon, and enhance the program to better meet the needs of Wisconsin farmers and their families.

Request:

The department requests an increase of \$800,000 GPR in FY26 and FY27 for a total of \$1,000,000 GPR ongoing annually for the Meat Processing Plant grant program. The 2023-25 budget provided an increase of \$1,600,000 GPR in FY24 on a one-time basis, bringing the total Meat Processing Plant grant program funding to \$1,800,000 GPR in FY24. Funding returned to \$200,000 GPR in FY25.

Analysis:

The Meat Processor Grant Program was created in 2021 Wisconsin Act 58 to provide grants to facilities that slaughter animals for human consumption, or that process meat or meat products, excluding rendering plants, to promote the growth of the meat industry in Wisconsin. The program was modeled after the Dairy Processing Plant Grant program.

As indicated in the table, DATCP continues to receive applications for funding exceeding the base level of \$200,000 – further documenting the industry need. The table below demonstrates the unmet need to support an increase in funding.

Helping Wisconsin's meat processing plants to keep their facilities operating and equipment updated can make them more efficient and able to assist producers and consumers. Meat processors who have completed grant projects have added over 40 jobs in their businesses. Those businesses expect that the increased efficiency through upgrades and modernization will boost sales to their businesses. Increased revenue ranges from \$108,000 per year to over \$1,000,000.

Request:

The department requests \$1,500,000 PR annually to continue providing food assistance to nonprofit organizations and food producers that serve tribal elders. The 2023-25 budget provided one-time funding of \$1,500,000 PR in both FY24 and FY25.

Analysis:

The department's Tribal Elder Food Security program began in FY24. The program is designed to provide grants to nonprofit food assistance organizations for the purpose of purchasing and distributing food to tribal elders and supporting the growth and operations of participating food producers and processors.

In FY24, a request for proposal was circulated for the grant program. Two proposals were received and both were chosen for completing this work. Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin received an award of \$1,298,665 and Hunger Task Force, Inc. received an award of \$201,335. These recipients have until June 1, 2025, to expend their grant funds. A minimum of 90% of the budget must be spent on food procurement. Funds must be used to support Tribal members and serve multiple Tribal nations in Wisconsin.

NARRATIVE

The department requests \$10.0 million in additional bonding authority for the Soil and Water Resource Management Program. Bonding supports cost-share grants to landowners for installation of runoff control technology. This is a request that is a part of the State's long running nonpoint water pollution efforts.

Soil and Water Resource Management Program Bonding Authority

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4007

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests an increase of \$10,000,000 in bond authority for landowner costsharing provided through the soil and water resource management program (SWRM) authorized by Chapter 92, Stats. The department has received additional bond authority or GPR funds in each biennium since 2008.

Analysis:

The department administers the Soil and Water Resource Management (SWRM) grant program under s. 92.14, Wis. Stats. The department plans to allocate half of the authorization as grants awarded to counties in each year of the biennium. Counties use these funds to provide costsharing to farmers and other landowners for conservation practices such as manure storage facilities, systems to control runoff from barnyards and feed storage, waterways and other erosion controls, and shoreline and stream bank protection. Under state law (s. 281.16, Wis. Stats.), certain farmers must receive cost-sharing of 70 percent (90 percent in the case of economic hardship) if they are required to install conservation practices. The requested increase in funding ensures an adequate supply of cost-sharing for farmers, supports the installation of practices that protect water quality, and sustains progress in implementing state nonpoint pollution control goals.

DATCP has been authorized \$7,000,000 in new bonding authority in each biennium beginning in 2007-09 except for the 2023-25 state budget. In that budget, the funding was provided as GPR. The department typically provides \$3.5 million per year for grants to landowners. This total funds only about half the requests submitted annually related to cost sharing for structural practices.

Access to cost-sharing is critical to farmers for the following reasons:

• It supports the installation of conservation practices that prevent runoff and protect groundwater, enabling farmers to protect impaired waters, groundwater, and

environmentally sensitive areas such as the Silurian bedrock performance standard zone.

- It helps farmers install grassed waterways, manure storage, and other practices used to implement nutrient management plans that meet the requirements of DATCP's 2018 enhanced nutrient management technical standard.
- It expands the resources available to farmers to meet increased conservation responsibilities, including all the NR 151 performance standards.
- It helps offset the increased costs for installing practices. Costs, including material costs, have increased due to tighter technical requirements implemented in response to new scientific research.
- It helps meet the increased demand for funding to protect water quality from polluting sources such as collapsed streambanks, blown out culverts, and eroded crop fields due to destructive weather events in recent years.

NARRATIVE

The department requests \$3,140,500 annually above base level funding to maintain current funding levels. Of this amount \$1,413,200 is GPR and \$1,727,300 is Environmental Fund SEG.

County Conservation Staff and Support

Biennial Budget Issue Paper DIN 4008

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests an increase of \$1,413,200 GPR and an increase of \$1,727,300 SEG for the County Conservation Staff and Support grant program in both FY26 and FY27. The 2023-25 budget provided an increase of \$1,500,200 SEG and \$750,100 GPR in FY25 on a one-time basis. The department requests the one-time funding be ongoing funding and to also increase funding to fully fund 100% of the first position and 70% of the second. This funding level would continue to support staff in county land conservation departments and enable them to implement the state's land and water conservation programs which protect and improve soil and water quality. Total funding, including base funding, would be \$12,104,600 in FY26 and FY27.

Analysis:

DATCP has provided funding to county land conservation departments (LCDs) to support staff and activities that protect and conserve our state's soil and water resources since 1989. Eligible funding activities include: land and water resource management plan development and implementation; engineering, design, and installation of conservation practices; cost-share grant administration; farmland preservation program administration; and livestock siting and manure storage ordinance implementation, among other related things. County conservation staff also play a key role in the implementation of the voluntary Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) -- a federal, state, local, and private partnership program aimed at incentivizing removal of environmentally sensitive land from agricultural production and establishing permanent vegetative cover by paying farmers and ranchers an annual rental payment.

County conservation staff are the "boots on the ground" for implementing nearly all the state's nonpoint source programs, standards, and regulations. DATCP provides funding to the county LCDs under s. 92.14 (6)(b) Wis. Stats., which states that it is the state's goal to provide annual funding "for an average of three staff persons per county with full funding for the first staff person, 70 percent funding for the second staff person, and 50 percent funding for any additional staff persons." DATCP currently uses the following formula to distribute staffing funds. Each county receives a base allocation of \$75,000. Remaining funding is then allocated to provide for 100% funding for the first LCD staff position, 70% of the second position and 50% for each position thereafter. DATCP has not been provided sufficient funds to meet the statutory goal.

Currently, DATCP is able to support 100% of each county LCD's first position, but is unable to fully fund the goal 70% of the second position. Historically, there has been insufficient funding to fully meet the statutory goal for the 2nd position or provide any funding for the third position. Therefore, counties either make due with very few conservation staff (resulting in less capacity to

deliver conservation programming and resource protection practices to their county's farmers), or support additional staff solely through the county tax levy.

Providing ongoing funding for staff will improve the effectiveness of county conservation efforts in responding to issues of state significance, while maintaining the statewide structure for local delivery of soil and water resource management programs. County land and water conservation departments are the backbone of Wisconsin's conservation system and are fundamental to our efforts to protect and improve the state's soil and water resources. Counties are required by law to develop and implement Land and Water Resource Management (LWRM) plans that include both state and local priorities. Since 2002, DATCP and DNR have relied heavily on counties to implement state agricultural performance standards, but funding for staff has been insufficient to tackle this huge workload beyond a voluntary basis. County land conservation departments are also responsible for implementing numerous programs at the local level and funding for staff to implement these programs has not kept pace with the administrative and technical requirements. For example, counties with the farmland preservation program must document landowner compliance with the conservation standards for each participant at least once every four years. If participants are found to be out of compliance, it takes a significant amount of time to assist those landowners to regain compliance, so they are eligible for tax credits.

Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection September 16, 2024

Request:

The department requests an increase of \$250,000 SEG in FY26 and FY27 in s. 20.115 (7)(qf), soil and water management; aids, to support the Producer-Led Watershed Protection Grant program (PLWPG). The 2023-25 budget provided an increase of \$250,000 SEG annually on a one-time basis.

Analysis:

The PLWPG program was created in 2016 to empower farmer-led groups to conduct outreach activities, provide on-farm demonstration and research sites, and promote voluntary agricultural conservation practices in their local watersheds through a peer-to-peer model. This program has been an effective tool to increase farmer participation in agricultural nonpoint source pollution abatement activities that improve water quality and soil health.

Farmer participation in the PLWPG program has continued to grow at a rapid pace. In 2024, 47 groups received \$1,000,000 in total funding. This represents a 336% increase in the number of groups participating since program inception in 2016, when 14 groups received \$250,000. The impact of the program also continues to expand. In 2023, producer-led groups implemented conservation practices on 1.47 million acres, a 34% increase from 2022. Without additional funds, awards would need to be significantly reduced and multiple groups would likely not be funded, ultimately leading to a reduction in local farmer-led nonpoint source abatement activities and potential lapsing of groups.

Analysis:

2021 Act 223 established a cover crop insurance rebate program to implement strategies that encourage broader use of cover crops to benefit Wisconsin soils, surface water and groundwater. Initial program funding was provided in the 2022-23 fiscal year. Through the Crop Insurance Premium Rebates for Planting Cover Crops Program, the department is authorized to provide a rebate of \$5.00 per acre for which a cover crop is planted for the crop insurance premiums paid on those acres. During each application period, \$800,000 was appropriated to fund up to 160,000 acres of applications for insurance premium rebates through the program. In the first year of the program, there were not \$800,000 in eligible requests during the application period. The program rewards existing adopters of cover crops to preserve soil and water resources.

The department requests an ongoing increase of \$85,000 SEG in FY26 and FY27 s. 20.115 (7)(qd), soil and water administration; environmental fund, for the Bureau of Land and Water Resources. The Environmental Fund began FY24 with a \$60,707,000 undesignated balance.

Analysis:

In recent years, the number of environmental programs the bureau administers has grown without a corresponding increase in resources to manage them. Examples include the Nitrogen Optimization Pilot program and the Cover Crop Insurance Premium Rebate program. Additional funding has also been provided for Producer-Led Watershed Protection grants and changes have been made to the Farmland Preservation program that have increased expenses.

Additionally, the department has various program revenue - service (PR-S) appropriations which incur costs that are charged back to the users of the services provided. For example, computer system equipment, staff and services, and central administrative services appropriations are charged back to those who utilize the services. The chargeback to users to fully fund these appropriations has also increased. At the same time, many of the department's appropriations have not realized a change in their supplies and services funding in many years. Hence, it has gotten more difficult for users to fund these needed services.

Request:

The department requests an ongoing increase of \$125,000 SEG in FY26 and FY27 for s. 20.115 (7)(r), general program operations; agrichemical management, for the Bureau of Agrichemical Management.

Analysis:

The department regulates materials used in agricultural production. The cost to perform these regulatory functions has increased. For example, the cost to perform environmental testing has increased significantly. Laboratory testing expenses in s. 20.115 (7)(r) have increased from approximately \$1,500,000 in FY20 to over \$2,000,000 in FY24. Budget authority to compensate for all these expenses has not occurred. As another example, travel costs are necessary to administer and monitor our agrichemical management programs. Over the last 6 years, travel costs have fluctuated from as low as \$95,600 in FY21 to as high as \$169,200 in FY24.

Additionally, the department has various program revenue - service (PR-S) appropriations which incur costs that are charged back to the users of the services provided. For example, computer system equipment, staff and services, and central administrative services appropriations are charged back to those who utilize the services.
