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2013 Legislative Session - A Citizen's Guide

The 2013-2014 legislative sessions began when the new legislature was sworn in on January 7, 2013. The schedule of floor periods for the new session was established by Senate Joint Resolution 1.

Notification service. The legislature's Wisconsin Legislative Notification Service makes following the legislative process easier for interested citizens. Registered users can receive daily or weekly emails when specified legislative activity occurs. For example, users may choose to be notified about every action affecting a specific proposal, bills introduced by a particular legislator, activities of a specific committee, or introductions relating to a particular topic. Internet Broadcast of Floor Debate. Citizens can listen to live floor debate in both houses using the Legislature's InSession service: Senate audio and Assembly audio. Broadcasts are live only. If one house or the other is not in session, there is no audio available. The Assembly offers live video as well, with links from the InSession page. The InSession pages also provide the day's calendar with links from the calendar to bills before the house and to roll call votes as they occur. Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services Funding

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) administers the Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) program. The AFG Program consists of three different funding opportunities. Information including the program guidance documents, frequently asked questions, and the link to the applications can be found at http://www.fema.gov/welcome-assistance-firefighters-grant-program.

<u>Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG)</u> – This grant opportunity offers fire departments and non-affiliated Emergency Medical Service providers the chance to submit three grant applications. All three applications are due at the same time. The match for this grant is between 5% and 20% depending on your jurisdiction size. The maximum amount an applicant can apply for is \$1 million. *The 2013 application period is estimated to be open during June or July.*

- Operations and Safety The Ops and Safety grant application can include requests for many things including: training, equipment (rescue tools, ladders, hose, etc.), personal protective equipment (turnout gear, air packs, etc.), modifications to facilities (sprinkler systems, smoke and fire alarm systems, vehicle exhaust systems, etc.), and wellness/fitness programs (physicals, immunizations, health screenings, etc.).
- Vehicles Money for vehicles is limited to 25% of the total grant dollars available, competition for vehicles is
 extremely competitive. Departments can apply for a pumper, tanker/tender, brush truck, aerial, or quint;
 depending what size your jurisdiction is. Fire departments can also request all the NFPA required
 equipment as part of their application. The age of the vehicle, age of the total fleet, and your call volume are
 taken into consideration for the competitive request.
- Regional Communication Projects Any eligible applicant, including fire departments or nonaffiliated EMS organizations, may act as a "host applicant" and apply for a communications project on behalf of itself and any number of organizations in neighboring jurisdictions. A regional project is one in which multiple organizations serving more than one local jurisdiction benefit directly from the activities implemented with the grant funds. Regional projects should be designed to facilitate interoperability and efficiency among the participating jurisdictions. Law enforcement can benefit from this grant. However, any equipment purchased with the grant must physically be distributed to all the departments in the indentified region.

<u>AFG – Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FPS)</u> – FPS offers grants to support activities designed to reach high-risk target groups and mitigate incidences of death and injuries caused by fire and fire-related hazards. The match for this grant is between 5% and 20% depending on your jurisdiction size. Eligible projects include the following: general education awareness (smoke alarms, sprinkler awareness, public education, juvenile fire setter projects, etc.), code enforcement and/or awareness, and fire and arson investigation. *The 2013 estimated application period is expected to be open in September.*

<u>AFG - Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants (SAFER)</u> – SAFER grants provide financial assistance to help fire departments increase their cadre of frontline firefighters or to rehire firefighters that have been laid off. The goal is to assist local fire departments with staffing and deployment capabilities so they may respond to emergencies whenever they occur, assuring their communities have adequate protection from fire and fire-related hazards. SAFER offers grants to support activities in two categories: (1) Hiring of Firefighters and (2) Recruitment and Retention of Volunteer Firefighters. It is important to check the program guidance for the required match for this opportunity as it has changed several times. *The 2013 application period is expected to be open in July or August.*
