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USDA Partners to Improve Rural Water Infrastructure

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is investing in infrastructure projects to **upgrade water and wastewater systems** in rural communities. Applications are currently being accepted for the USDA Water and Waste Disposal Loan and Grant program.

This program provides funding for clean and reliable drinking water systems, sanitary sewage disposal, sanitary solid waste disposal, and storm water drainage to households and businesses in eligible rural areas. Areas that may be served include rural areas and towns with populations of 10,000 or less, and tribal lands in rural areas.

Funds may be used to finance the acquisition, construction or improvement of:

- Drinking water sourcing, treatment, storage and distribution
- Sewer collection, transmission, treatment and disposal
- Solid waste collection, disposal and closure
- Storm water collection, transmission and disposal

In some cases, funding may also be available for related activities such as:

- Legal and engineering fees
- Land acquisition, water and land rights, permits and equipment
- Start-up operations and maintenance
- Interest incurred during construction
- Purchase of facilities to improve service or prevent loss of service
- Other costs determined to be necessary for completion of the project

Congress provided a historic level of funding for water and wastewater infrastructure in FY 2018. The 2018 Omnibus spending bill includes \$5.2 billion for USDA loans and grants, up from \$1.2 billion in FY 2017. It also directs Agriculture Secretary Perdue to make investments in rural communities with the greatest infrastructure needs.

2019 WI RPCs & DNR Great Lakes Basin Tree Planting Grant Program

The Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission is excited to announce available funding under the 2019 WI RPCs & DNR Tree Planting Grant Program. This program is a partnership with the Wisconsin DNR, East Central Wisconsin RPC, Northwest Wisconsin RPC, and Southeastern Wisconsin RPC. The funding opportunity is aimed at helping communities, counties, and tribes plant trees to mitigate Emerald Ash Borer impacts and reduce runoff.

The funding is available to all Wisconsin jurisdictions within the Great Lakes Basin. Approximately \$120,000 will be available in this 2019 grant round to fund projects ranging in cost from \$1,000 to \$20,000. All communities within the Wisconsin Great Lakes Basin are eligible, but this program will particularly be targeting projects in communities:

- within watersheds with surface water quality concerns;
- on tribal lands;
- within communities that are members of a regional planning commission;
- within areas of concern (AOCs) for beneficial use impairments; and
- within Tree City USA communities.

2019-20 Coastal Management Program Grants Available

The Wisconsin Coastal Management Program (WCMP) is seeking proposals to enhance, preserve, protect, and restore resources within the state's coastal zone—all counties adjacent to Lakes Superior and Michigan, with their nearly 1000 miles of shoreline. The WCMP anticipates awarding up to \$1.5 million in grant funding.

WCMP Grants are available for coastal wetland protection and habitat restoration, nonpoint source pollution control, coastal resource and community planning, Great Lakes education, public access, and historic preservation.

Applications are due **November 2, 2018**.

Applicants are encouraged to contact WCMP staff early to discuss ideas for project proposals and application requirements.

When developing proposals, please pay close attention to the following items:

- Application materials and the Request for Proposals are available on the WCMP website (http://coastal.wisconsin.gov).
- There is a cost-share requirement for all projects. Matching funds must be from non-federal sources, and may be in the form of in-kind contributions.
- For habitat restoration and construction projects, be sure to include copies of all required permits or permit applications and title documentation with the application materials.
- For all projects, be sure to include copies of required documentation and letters of support.
