RPA.wi.gov: What the System Is

- Introduced mid-2017
- Intended to:
 - Streamline the RPA approval process
 - Increase transparency
 - Provide real-time feedback of progress through approval phases
 - Improve data collection and reporting abilities
 - Increase consistency



RPA.wi.gov: Main Features & Functions

- Online forms to enter information
- Upload documents, provide links to required documents
- Track progress of request after submittal
- Approvers can send request back to agency for additional information
- Approvers provide signatures electronically
- Reports available to track amount of time requests spend in each phase



RPA.wi.gov: Latest Enhancements

- Consolidated IT waiver requests
- Pending:
 - View-only access by phase and agency
 - Consolidated vehicle requests

\$150K: What the System Is

- Introduced this year as a result of Executive Order 288
 - EO 288 requires all State agencies obtain approval of the DOA Secretary prior to making Information Technology (IT)-related and private consulting purchases over \$150,000 (PIM 18-003)
- Each request is analyzed by:
 - State Bureau of Procurement (SBOP)
 - Division of Enterprise Technology (DET)
 - State Budget Office
 - Secretary's Office



\$150K: Main Features & Functions

- Online forms to enter information
- Upload documents, provide links to required documents
- Track progress of request after submittal
- Analysts and approvers can send request back to agency for additional information
- Approvers provide signatures electronically
- Reports available to track amount of time requests spend in each phase



\$150K: Latest Enhancements

- Updated tool for system: DOA-3310 form
 - Allows users to include additional details
 - Decreases the number of follow-up questions from analysts
 - Allows request to move through phases more quickly
- Pending system enhancements:
 - Adding a way for users to indicate criticality of request
 - Adding info for master leases
 - View only access

VendorNet: What the System Is

- An online State procurement information hub
- Available to the general public, with no login required to access information or searches
- Registration available to State agencies, UW System campuses, and municipalities, and provides the ability to post solicitations and contracts



VendorNet: Main Features & Functions

- Publicly available searches for:
 - Contracts
 - Solicitations (including those posted on eSupplier)
 - Forms
 - NIGP code lookup
- General procurement information and links to resources
- Contact information for the SBOP Help Desk (DOAWisPro@wisconsin.gov)



VendorNet: Latest Enhancements

- VendorNet's role/purpose shifted with the introduction of eSupplier in September 2017
 - Bidders can't register on or login to VendorNet
 - Additional filters added to Bids tab to include solicitations posted to eSupplier
- VendorNet and eSupplier work together behind the scenes to share a single bidder file



WISBuy

An electronic marketplace containing State-contracted pricing for items from a variety of vendors





WISBuy: What the System Is

- An online marketplace containing catalogs from State-contracted vendors
- Benefits of shopping through WISBuy include:
 - Prices reflect the State-negotiated rates
 - Knowing purchases are made from the appropriate contracts without needing to do extra research
 - Feel safe knowing you're getting the added protection of Statenegotiated warranty terms
 - Ability to purchase from multiple vendors from a single website



WISBuy: Main Features & Functions

- eCatalog (purchase orders) vs. PCard Marketplace (PCard)
- Punchout vs. hosted catalogs
- Catalogs are sorted by contracts, which are linked to VendorNet



WISBuy: Latest Enhancements

- Continually looking at including additional catalogs
- WISBuy survey recently sent to users
 - Feedback to be used to inform decisions about the system
