AGENCY DESCRIPTION

The board is composed of eight citizen members appointed by the Governor for two-year terms. The board is supported by a staff of thirteen full-time employees, including the executive director who is the agency head and the chief election officer of the state. The board's programs are administered by two sections, elections and campaign finance.

MISSION

The mission of the board is to enhance representative democracy by ensuring the integrity of the electoral process. To achieve the mission, the board directs its energies toward providing for an informed electorate, both in regard to understanding the election system and to being aware of the activities and finances of candidates for public office. Elections must be administered through procedures that guarantee that the vote of each individual counts and that the will of the electorate prevails. Elections must be open, fair, impartial and free from error. The campaign finance disclosure system administered by the board must be geared toward making information readily available to the electorate on who is supporting or opposing which candidate or cause and to what extent, and toward reducing the opportunity for corruption.

PROGRAMS, GOALS, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Program 1: Administration of Election and Campaign Laws

Goal: Instill public confidence in the integrity of the electoral process by serving as an informational and educational resource for participants in the political process and the general public.

Objective/Activity: Increase educational outreach to election officials and candidates to reduce the number of staff initiated contacts to correct errors, obtain missing information, or clarify information received on county

canvass reports and ballot access documents. This will be done by promoting the submission of county canvass reports in electronic format and by the preparation and dissemination of informational materials for county clerks and candidates using written and electronic resources.

Goal: Make readily available to voters, complete information as to who is supporting or opposing which candidate or cause and to what extent, whether directly or indirectly. The board makes the following information available in the office: list of reports filed; summary of data reports; information about late campaign activity; and detailed campaign finance report information.

Objective/Activity: Enter campaign finance report data on the day of receipt and prepare and post reports on Web site within 24 hours of receipt.

The Governor proposes an election administration reform initiative to strengthen accountability for election results and to increase the public's confidence in the efficient administration of elections. As part of the initiative the Governor recommends: (a) requiring photo identification at polling places to ensure legitimacy at the voting booth; (b) a centralized registration list maintained by the board and \$70,000 GPR in FY03 for a grant program to assist localities with the costs to update registration data; (c) increased board authority over registration forms to eliminate fraudulent registration; (d) \$30,000 GPR in FY03 to fund a required training program for election observers to be administered by the board; and (e) increased board supervision over local election practices. The board would have the power to promulgate rules to promote the fair and efficient conduct of elections and the power to appoint election inspectors and special masters to conduct elections in locations which have repeatedly failed to comply with election laws or the rules of the board. If the municipality fails to reimburse the board for the costs related to the appointment of a special master, the costs may be deducted from the municipality's next shared revenue payment. To assist in the implementation of this initiative the Governor recommends approving 1.0 FTE GPR position. The Governor also recommends funding a task force charged with finding ways to use technology to increase voter participation as part of the E-government initiative. Any recommendations would be addressed through separate legislation or in the 2003-05 biennial budget. See Department of Administration, Item #16.
