AGENCY DESCRIPTION

The department was created by Chapter 479, Laws of 1929. The department is headed by a nine-member board, including two consumer representatives, appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate for staggered six-year terms. The Governor also appoints a secretary, with the advice and consent of the Senate, to administer the department. The department's programs are administered through six divisions: Food Safety, Trade and Consumer Protection, Animal Health, Agricultural Development, Agricultural Resource Management, and Management Services.

The office of the secretary includes the deputy secretary, executive assistant and budget director. Attached directly to the secretary's office are the office of legal counsel and the Wisconsin Agricultural Statistics Service.

MISSION

The mission of the department is to serve the citizens of Wisconsin by developing, implementing and communicating public policies that:

- Promote, protect and strengthen the financial soundness and competitive viability of Wisconsin's agricultural industry; and
- Assure citizens' safety, security and confidence in the agricultural and nonagricultural products and services of our marketplace.

PROGRAMS, GOALS, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Program 1: Food Safety and Consumer Protection

Goal: Assure fair business practices for buyers and sellers and safe products for consumers and the environment by establishing and enforcing legal standards, by mediating disputes between consumers and businesses, and by providing consumer education and information to Wisconsin citizens.

Objective/Activity: Return to consumers and government money gained through unfair business practices.

Program 3: Marketing Services

Goal: Identify and develop new profit centers and opportunities for farmers and agribusiness and provide information, programs and services that can result in increased income. Create an environment that fosters new development and opportunities in agriculture.

Objective/Activity: Develop a more diversified and profitable agricultural industry in Wisconsin through agricultural development and diversification grants, and educational and outreach activities.

Program 7: Agricultural Resource Management

Goal: Improve environmental, public health and livestock protection in Wisconsin.

Objective/Activity: Reduce the danger of unintended exposure to agricultural pesticides and other hazardous farm chemicals.

Program 8: Central Administrative Services

Goal: Support the vision and goals of the department by partnering with management and staff to provide information, advice and expertise that support the needs of the business.

Objective/Activity: Resolve computer and computer-user problems, to the user's satisfaction, in a timely manner.

1. Livestock Industry Support

The Governor recommends establishing a livestock modernization tax credit similar to the dairy modernization tax credit. Livestock would include bovine animals, swine, poultry, fish, sheep and goats. Individuals would be allowed to claim the credit for an amount equal to ten percent of the amount paid in the tax year to modernize or expand their livestock farm. The new tax credit is projected to reduce taxes paid by farmers by \$1.7 million in FY07. The Governor further recommends authorizing the department to charge a fee and to contract with an agent for the administration of the livestock premises identification system. The agent would be allowed to collect and retain the fee revenue to cover the costs of administering the system. The Governor also recommends providing funding for per diem and staff support costs of the Livestock Facility Siting Board.

4. Consumer Protection Transfer

The Governor recommends consolidating consumer protection regulation in the Department of Justice to increase coordination and efficiency. The Governor further recommends reducing position and expenditure authority in the department to reflect the transfer. The Governor also recommends renaming the department to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Rural Resources to reflect its changed duties. The Department of Justice would be given regulatory authority over consumer issues including fraudulent representations, product safety and the telemarketing do-not-call list. The department would retain authority over weights and measures, and agricultural trade practices. The authority to bring court actions involving the transferred issues would be given to the Department of Justice and, in some cases, district attorneys. See Department of Justice, Item #4.

The Governor recommends consolidating server and network support and certain procurement and purchasing functions in the Department of Administration and standardizing staffing levels related to human resources and payroll benefit services across agencies beginning in FY07 to create administrative efficiencies. The Governor recommends improving the provision of state legal services by consolidating attorneys and legal support staff under the secretary of the Department of Administration on January 1, 2006. The Department of Administration secretary will determine the assignment of attorneys to individual agencies. To achieve this, the Governor recommends transferring 7.5 FTE positions to the Department of Administration. The Governor further recommends retaining the funding associated with these positions in the department to purchase legal services from the Department of Administration. In addition, 1.0 FTE unclassified position is created to provide general counsel services. See Department of Administration, Item #3.

The Governor recommends transferring balances to the general fund from the following appropriations and fund: (a) \$250,000 PR in FY06 from s. 20.115(1)(i); (b) \$50,000 PR in FY06 from s. 20.115(7)(ja); and (c) \$130,100 SEG in each year from the agrichemical management fund.
